Thomas, known as Tom was born at Laura 12 September 1906. He was the second son of Michael and Catherine Anastasia Dee (*nee* Green) and was the fifth child in a family of eight. His parents had the Royal Mail Hotel at Stone Hut until 1913, when the family moved, firstly to Mundoora, and then to Freeling. By 1922 the family was living in Adelaide.

Tom was still living in Adelaide when he enlisted in the Royal Australian Navy on 26 April 1927 at Port Adelaide, aged 20. His
