## Note

After the remains of HMAS Sydney were found off the coast of Western Australia, our mother, Patricia A Hall ( nee Giles), telephoned us after reading through the crew list in The Advertiser newspaper published at Adelaide, South Australia.

- 1. As background, our mother, born in 1925, was a young schoolgirl in Kapunda, South Australia at the outbreak of WW2. She was the sister of 4 boys, 3 of whom made the ultimate sacrifice.
- 2. From recollection, the conversation went as follows-" when I was 14, I was on my bicycle at the top end of the street (Coghill Street in Kapunda) when I was struck to see the sailors uniform of a young boy coming down our street. To me as a young country schoolgirl, he stood out in his uniform, as Kapunda is a country town well away from the sea. And to my recollection no others in Kapunda had joined the Navy; the Army was the more likely Service for the Boys to join." He had lived with his grandmother who lived behind our family house."
- 3. She felt a great degree of sadness for the boy and his grandmother and said a prayer for the young man.

To assist anybody building up a deeper picture of those times for Donald Betterman, there might be a chance to find a photograph of the young man from either Kapunda High School records/connections or from families of shipboard chums.
